We were quickly involved in moving to the lake. We found our lovely home and soon became involved in the ministries as charter members of Trinity Ecumenical Parish.

When I told some people with whom I worked that we were becoming involved in an ecumenical worship group which started as a Bible Study group and was working toward establishing an ecumenical church there were several, including a bishop, who said it would never work! Many of the group members worked formally and informally to set up a working church, despite the skepticism from many sides. We have continued to worship as a single parish, strengthened by our common practices and beliefs, and accepting with grace all the differences from our backgrounds and differing worship experiences.

Starting a Sunday School with a congregation made up almost exclusively of newly retired people was a daunting responsibility. We had far more teachers than students! I am so grateful to see the fine programs that have evolved to produce church education as a part of worship, youth activities, and intergenerational programs.

I have been involved in Trinity Ecumenical Parish as a Parish Council member, taught classes and led group discussions, and taken two mission trips to Mississippi after Katrina. I served as a volunteer at Lake Christian Ministries and was a Stephen Minister for several years. I am still a member of the Bible Study group which was the first activity I joined at Trinity.

Trinity is our church home and our church family. I am grateful to be part of this active, effective ministry.
